Tansen

1. Why did Swami Haridas say Tansen was ‘talented’?

Ans: Tansen, as a child had learnt to imitate the calls of birds and animals. One day Tansen saw Swami and his disciples resting in the forest. He hid behind a tree and roared like a tiger and managed to frighten his disciples. Swami Haridas was impressed by his skill, so said that Tansen was 'talented'.

2. Why did Akbar ask Tansen to join his court?

Ans: Tansen learnt music from Swami Haridas for eleven years. When Akbar heard him singing, he was impressed so asked him to join his court.

3. How do we know that Akbar was fond of Tansen? Give two reasons.
